

## A Scout's Report on the Internet of Things (IoT)

This presentation will explore the Internet of Things (IoT) and why it matters. Like all disruptive technologies, IoT comes with opportunities and threats. Boykin Jordan explores the hypothesis that how information security professionals as a community think about IoT security may be a bigger threat than the IoT devices themselves. He will focus our lively LifeBoat group discussion on these points:

- History repeats itself -- change and sensors are not new
- When change comes -- old security frameworks are a recipe for disaster
- New threat environments -- require new thinking about security
